## **Being Frank (15)**

**Thurs 2nd May at 7pm**

Director: Steve Sullivan. Starring: Frank Sidebottom, Johnny Vegas. UK, 2018, 103 mins  
Frank Sidebottom was the court jester of the Manchester music and comedy scene for over 25 years, but only a privileged few knew the man inside. This is a tale of split personalities - a suburban superhero with a fanatical desire to preserve the myth he created, and eventually having to battle against being consumed by his alter ego.
