Director: Michael Engler. Starring: Matthew Goode, Tuppence Middleton. UK, 2019, tbc mins







Location & Access

Pedestrian access to the Historic Dockyard is through Victory Gate on The Hard next to HMS Warrior. After passing through the gate, turn right into College Road and walk 50 metres to find the entrance to No.6 Cinema on the left.

Public Transport

We are a five minute walk from Portsmouth Harbour Station, the Gosport and Isle of Wight passenger ferries, The Hard Interchange bus & coach terminal and taxi rank.

Car Parking

Park in The Harbour car park at Havant Street (behind The Hard) and bring your ticket stub marked "No.6 Cinema" to the box office to receive £1 discount on your fee. Portsmouth Historic Dockyard car park is now open in the evenings. It is 400 yds from the main entrance in Admiralty Road. Follow the brown tourism signs.
