

## **The Alpinist (12A)**

As the sport of climbing turns from a niche pursuit to mainstream media experience, Marc-André Leclerc climbs alone. On remote alpine faces, the free-spirited 23-year-old makes some of the boldest solo ascents in history. Yet, he draws scant attention. Without a camera, rope, or any margin for error, Marc-André's approach is the essence of solo adventure.

Chai Vasarhelyi and Jimmy Chin explore the perilous world of cave diving, the bravery of the rescuers, and the dedication of an entire community that made great sacrifices to save these young boys.

### **YOUNG PROGRAMMERS' CHOICE**

Our young programmers' choice for the Nov/Dec programme is the 1997 film **GOOD WILL HUNTING**. Described as a psychological drama it also has elements of thriller and comedy. This film held a lot of appeal for 90's youth, who saw their own issues depicted in a film made by members of their own generation. It has undoubtedly retained its youth appeal to this day. Gus Van Sant, was the hip director of the time



and in many ways ahead of his time, as many films today strive for a similar style. Its setting in the Boston colleges including Harvard makes it a bit like *The Social Network*, but wittier and more intelligent. But it is the actors that make the film so compelling. Matt Damon, as the unrecognised genius, Will Hunting and Ben Affleck are brilliant in their first major movie roles. They should be as they wrote the script: it was their breakthrough into the world of cinema. Unknown as they were at the time, the 'big name' in the film is Robin Williams as Will's therapist, Sean Maguire. Williams shows his versatility here in a straight and serious role and was rightly acclaimed for his acting winning an Oscar for Best Supporting Actor. The two newcomers Damon and Affleck also won for Best Original Screenplay. There are also good roles for Minnie Driver and Casey Affleck. **GOOD WILL HUNTING** is a gripping film with lots of tension, emotion and great performances that show why the stars went on to bigger things.
